This course is five days of LIVE Zoom sessions, which will take place daily from 8:30 am-3:00 pm (PDT) on the days listed.

CE training provides an understanding of Structured Literacy and the use of the Orton Gillingham Approach based on the science of reading research. The course offers the skills to teach beginning readers, struggling readers, and those who have dyslexia.

The OG Approach is a structured, systematic, multisensory/multimodal, and diagnostic-prescriptive approach for the teaching of language skills (including reading, spelling, and handwriting) for students with dyslexia.

- Informal Assessment and diagnostic-prescriptive teaching
- Achieving accuracy, automaticity, and fluency in reading and spelling
