The Orton-Gillingham Approach is a structured, systematic, multisensory, and diagnostic-prescriptive approach for the teaching of language skills (including reading, spelling, and handwriting) for students with dyslexia. This course will provide participants with an introduction to the basics of the Orton-Gillingham Approach within a classroom or small group. Completion of this course and a supervised practicum will prepare the trainee to apply for OG Classroom Educator Certification through the Orton-Gillingham Academy (OGA).

Hosted at Westmark School in Encino, California, 30 hours of the course are in-person and 5 hours are independent assignments. Plan to complete 3-4 hours of independent prerequisite assignments prior to the first day of the course.
